Explorer Scout Caving

In September Ed Morris, Michael Chase and myself went with Ros and David to the Mendips on a Explorer Scout Caving Trip.

We arrived at the Village not far from the cave [Swildons Hole] where we changed in to Wetsuits, overalls, helmets and head lamps, before walking over the fields to the cave entrance. The Entrance was a small cylindrical hut with a hole in the base, we slipped down in to the hole and made our way down the cold rocky passage going over rocks and through cracks following the cave downwards. We entered several caverns and a few places where the cave split into other passages. Ros and David knew where they were going and kept leading us down further and further through cracks and fissures in the rocks. We reached the half way down point in the cave descent where there is a 5 meter ladder drop to the floor below, down the side of a waterfall. We passed that easily down into plunge pools and smaller waterfalls until we reached the end of the cave where the roof lowered into a puddle of water, this is called a sump, where you have to duck and swim under the rock face fully submerged in the icy cold water, pulling yourself along a rope fixed to the two sides. On the other side of the sump the cave was much different, it was lower and followed an underground stream, it was so low you had to crawl and swim. We went on like this until we arrived at the next sump where you need to wear weights to keep yourself from floating into the gap between the two sides of the sump. This is where we stopped and turned around going back through sump 1 and up a different route to the surface where we happily undressed from our wet cold clothes into warm clothes and had our lunch before driving home, exhausted but what an experience.
